

WE HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO BUILD TRANSITION FOR OUR TAMARIKI

As Principal I would like to say thank you to the Lake Tekapo Board of Trustees for the support and energy that they are putting in to ensure that Lake Tekapo School continues to improve its environment for our children. In recent weeks we have had notice that the school has received funding application approval from Genesis Energy, the Lake Tekapo Lions and most recently Foodstuffs. This funding is all a part of our Local Curriculum Initiative to include our outdoor spaces as part of our learning, now that we have completed the building work at school. This is a wonderful opportunity for our small school to build on what is already an incredible asset. Work will begin on our sandpit area with the hope to

include the Sprout Initiative at the back of the school with an environmental area and garden. This is hugely exciting and the work achieved by a small number of people needs to be recognised on behalf of our children. Thank you again to Genesis Energy, The Lake Tekapo Lions, Foodstuffs and the Lake Tekapo Community Board for their continued support of our school.





Other opportunities are being planned in line with the Localised Curriculum as well. Last week the children visited the Regional Park as the first of hopefully many, with the focus on Sprout and Paint the Town Green, the nursery and building our appreciation of this fantastic local asset. The children had their first Kapa Haka lesson in Fairlie with the Mackenzie School's which will take place fortnightly and we are hoping to join the Dark Sky Project team soon in partnership for lessons focussed on our sky and space.





Thank you to Nigel Frost for keeping our school pool operational with the kids getting both instructional swimming daily with a little water confidence thrown in. There is nothing better than watching kids grow in their confidence, whether that be putting their head under water or trusting their technique when diving (there has been some outstanding belly flops). Again, as a small school we are incredibly fortunate to have the support we do. Thank you.

#### These are:

- A new or worsening cough
- Sneezing and runny nose
- A fever
- Temporary loss of smell or altered sense of taste
- Sore throat
- Shortness of breath

Less common symptoms include diarrhoea, headache, muscle aches, nausea, vomiting, malaise, chest pain, abdominal pain, joint pain, or confusion/irritability.
