Board of Trustees and School Staff:

The Board of Trustees met last week to review and discuss plans and preparations for 2024 in line with our strategic plan. This work sits behind the daily running of the school and reflects the aspirations and targets we are aiming for. The Board of Trustees undertake a significant role as they act as parent representatives and bring a parental lens to a school governance model. This role is important also, in that, as a Board we must be responsive and agile to new government legislation, that most recently being the teaching of Reading, Writing and Mathematics for an hour a day and cellphone's at school. These constant changes do mean that we are reviewing and actioning regularly, but also demonstrate the need to have a strong direction and plan to navigate our way when these changes occur. As a Board of Trustees we are committed to the teaching and learning that happens here at Lake Tekapo School and in continuing to advance the Education Review Office evaluation of:

- learners developing their sense of identity, manaakitanga, whanaungatanga, place, and self.
- Involving the history, customs and ecology of our unique locality through a curriculum which strengthens and aligns student achievement, wellbeing, and engagement.
- Localising an integrated curriculum which clearly defines learning progressions for each student.
- Student having a 'sense of self' as a learner through engagement and participation in their unique learning process.
- community and school whānau having a strong sense of connection, participation, and engagement in their children's learning

Transition Goals - Lake Tekapo School and The Lake Tekapo Kindergarten.







Sitting within our "Plan on a Page" one of our aims is to continue to advance and grow our transition with Jasmine and her team across

the road. This on the surface seems obvious, but as with most things, rules, regulations, and sector differences sometimes get in the way. As you will be also aware staffing and consistency of staffing is pivotal in making plans and ideas happen also. We are so lucky to have the staff in both our Kura, passionate about aligning our aims and



aspirations for our local tamariki and already we are taking steps to ensure that what we talk about is happening at the chalk face. Last week Jasmine began running Reading workshops to encourage reading at home and in the coming weeks we will be meeting to discuss how we can align both the physical transition along with the Vision and Values we both share. Over the weekend, the combined parent group demonstrated with the 4WD fundraiser, the value that can be shared when pulling together our resources for our children. This is exciting work as it really does bring home the importance of putting our children at the centre and ensuring that "change" is seen as a normal progression, rather than one to be hesitant about. Tomorrow we will be sending out a combined letter that is aimed at celebrating both the diversity and expertise that is on offer here in Tekapo. This information will help us utilise the many skills and different cultures we have to allow us to build our local curriculum.

Kahui Ako - Regional Response Fund - Year 6 Transition Day:











As part of the Kahui Ako Leadership role, this year we have applied for and received an extra round of funding to sit alongside our Regional Response Funding One, set up in 2023. This funding was delivered through the use of cultural mentoring and with the support of a registered counsellor across our 7 kura, to enable easy access to services. With this second round of funding it has been decided to focus on our Year 6 transitioning students to High School. Transition to school is important to our Early Childhood children, so too is the milestone of students graduating from Primary school into Mackenzie College. The Kahui Ako has broadened our scope and included the skills of Active Engagement with our Year Six students, to help with and assist with the transition of our students to Mackenzie College. This programme will put an emphasis on supporting the leadership skills and cohesion, as these students move on. These days will be run over the term where we will engage with Te Aitarakihi Marae, Sport Canterbury, Wave, The District Health Board, our RTLB service, Emergency Services and speakers that will support

this initiative. The days will be underpinned by the 5 Ways to Wellbeing and Te Whare Tapa Rima and will be engaging, fun, but designed for real life learning.





Opportunity to Host Students Hosting Families

We have been approached from the Director of Pas Grau Ski Club, Juliet Satherwaite, for families to have the opportunity (paid) to host skiers for three weeks during August 2024. These children are from families are aged between 14-16 years old. Our plan is to ski in New Zealand for 3 weeks during August/ September at Roundhill and Dobson, and visit the region.

The goal is to offer the children a NZ experience of living in an English speaking family, and experiencing the NZ culture. It would be a hosting situation for which we would compensate the host families (remuneration) for the care. The total time period would be 3.5 weeks and families would be reimbursed for this. This reimbursement would need to cover: lodgings with family and 3 meals a day (breakfast, lunch to take to the mountain and dinner). The daily routine would be that children would be collected at 7.30am, they would be with Juliet (and their coaches) all day until drop off at approx 4-5pm. One day per week rest from skiing, during which we would also take the children to visit the area.

The children can speak 4 languages, (French, Spanish, Catalan fluently) and also have a medium level of English. The goal of the trip is to ski every day possible, and Juliet would be responsible for the transport every day, collecting and delivering the children from a meeting point or their homes. Living with a family would give them a "NZ experience" which would strengthen their English, and be a great cultural opportunity.
