Professional Development at Lake Tekapo School

At Lake Tekapo School both Maria and Angela are undertaking Professional Development in Structured Literacy, using the Ministry of Education funded BSLA (Better Start Literacy Approach). This approach focuses on teaching the code of the English language in the first two years at school. Letter-sound knowledge is taught, practised at a word level and then a text will come home. The focus is on segmenting (sounding out a word) and then blending (putting it together). Reading words on a page

is no longer a guessing game, they are developing strategies to decode. This structured literacy approach has been recommended for students with dyslexia and those who are having difficulty with decoding words, as it directly addresses phonological skills, decoding, and spelling. The new texts are sequenced in seven stages to teach children the 44 sounds of the English language and the principles of the alphabetic code. We will continue to focus on phonics, phonemic awareness, building vocabulary and the children's oral language skills to develop equally strong foundations for comprehension and writing.

The Wonder Project: Our New Staff Member









