




positive to share. As a staff we value the open door and acknowledge that lives are incredibly busy, so making a convenient time is always beneficial so that we respond, rather than react.

2024 Annual Improvement Plan - Draft



In line with the school's Strategy Plan the Board of Trustees have reviewed our strategic goals, school wide data and prepared the new Annual Improvement Plan for the Ministry of Education. This review has noted the need for the school to continue to build on its reporting processes through Educa for stakeholders, while working at moderating school wide learning progressions, with the Kahui Ako cluster of schools, that align to the refreshed New Zealand curriculum.

This work has tied in well with the school wide target and implementation of a "structured

literacy" programme, known as "ideal", that staff have been evaluating throughout term one. This programme will begin to take shape next term school wide and focus on Phonology and Phonological Awareness, Phonics, Fluency, Vocabulary, Comprehension, and Syntax. This will form part of our literacy target.






Story Lines Author Visit:





Opportunity to Host Students Hosting Families

We have been approached from the Director of Pas Grau Ski Club, Juliet Satherwaite, for families to have the opportunity (paid) to host skiers for three weeks during August 2024. These children are from families are aged between 14-16 years old. Our plan is to ski in New Zealand for 3 weeks during August/ September at Roundhill and Dobson, and visit the region.

The goal is to offer the children a NZ experience of living in an English speaking family, and experiencing the NZ culture. It would be a hosting situation for which we would compensate the host families (remuneration) for the care. The total time period would be 3.5 weeks and families would be reimbursed for this. This reimbursement would need to cover: lodgings with family and 3 meals a day (breakfast, lunch to take to the mountain and dinner). The daily routine would be that children would be collected at 7.30am, they would be with Juliet (and their coaches) all day until drop off at approx 4-5pm. One day per week rest from skiing, during which we would also take the children to visit the area.

The children can speak 4 languages, (French, Spanish, Catalan fluently) and also have a medium level of English. The goal of the trip is to ski every day possible, and Juliet would be responsible for the transport every day, collecting and delivering the children from a meeting point or their homes. Living with a family would give them a "NZ experience" which would strengthen their English, and be a great cultural opportunity.
