Rosie Revere and Term 3:





Of every term, term 3 at Lake Tekapo School is always the hardest. This is not to sound like a criticism, but more recognition that for our kids the winter term is incredibly full with winter sports. The active nature of our children and the connection they have with their environment really reinforces the unique culture that is our school. The school staff are aware of this and continue to work out ways to cater for curriculum needs and local ways to support our children with their learning. One of these approaches has been the staff made booklets on focussed topics that have been trialled over successive terms. These enable staff in a multi-level classroom to scaffold the children's learning. They

have been intentional to help us try to cater for the many different levels that operate in both of our classrooms. This concept has grown out of conversations with parents around home learning, around the

concept of curiosity and creativity for the children, around choice and extension for our children and as a way to move from simple traditional ability grouping to mix abilities in terms of strengths and weaknesses. As a staff this has had mixed results and possibly has not been communicated well by the school. The children have not missed out in their learning, but as was discussed at Parent Information night and Parent interviews, there is a need to develop learning around intrinsic motivation, the value children bring to school and a need to reaffirm the parent-student-teacher relationship, so that the learning is being owned by students and supported by parents and teachers. This will form the basis of our Parent / Student survey next term and we ask that you consider the learning that you would like at Lake Tekapo School for your child(ren). With education being used as a political football, one thing we can do as a small school is operate under the mandate of our community.

Aoraki Mt Cook Visit

On Tuesday we welcomed Aoraki Mt Cook students and staff to Lake Tekapo for a day of sharing and socialisation. It is hoped that days like this happen more frequently for our Mackenzie cluster of schools with the children benefiting from making new friends and mixing and playing with others and the staff having the opportunity to share teaching resources and strategies. One of these was the use of BOOM Whackers that looks at musicality and sequencing using pitch related tubes and body percussion. It was a massive amount of fun and a great example of coordination, timing and rhythm all pulled into one. There is always room for improvement.

Thank you for the Tremendous Effort:






