

Parent Interviews:



Parent Interview time is incredibly valuable for staff and thank you for the turn-out last week to discuss with you, and your child(ren), their progress and feelings about school. These conversations help us to recalibrate and allow us the opportunity to have open and honest conversations that are face to face. We were delighted to see many parents bring their child(ren) to the interviews and hearing directly from the kids what is working well and what, from their perspective, can be improved. Parent/Teacher interviews are an essential part of your child(ren)'s

education, but as these are only scheduled twice a year, the emphasis at Lake Tekapo School is an open door to touch base at a time convenient to all parties. We would like to reinforce this idea so that we are not waiting for a formal school setting. If you have an inkling, concern or something positive to feed back to the school, your first approach should always be the teachers or staff member involved. Often school life can be incredibly busy with the dynamic of children and families, so please also be conscious that queries may not be immediate, as we are conscious of responding rather than reacting.

Speech Competition:

This important role lets the staff take a step back and watch the children present, while allowing each child the opportunity to put their best foot forward. The feedback from parents has been hugely positive and the staff were so incredibly impressed by both the confidence and enthusiasm of each child to step up and say their speech. Public speaking can be a task deemed not everyone's cup of tea, but the fact we saw each child stand and deliver was a credit to the children.


