COVID 19 Update:


Thank you for your response to date concerning Omicron and keeping children at home if they are feeling unwell. This has been appreciated by the staff and school with the Health and Wellbeing for our children, staff and community being a top priority. We received news last night that one staff member has been identified as a household contact and therefore will be self isolating over the next seven days. This is an inevitability, with one of the biggest challenges for us ensuring that we have enough staff on-site at school, especially with the common colds and isolation requirements of household contacts. It is important to note that legally we must have two staff members on-site at all times, regardless of the number of children on site, to remain open.
