The Lake Tekapo School Board of Trustees and staff are reviewing last year and pulling together initiatives that help



us promote the ever increasing changes and expectations in education. This is a balancing act for primary schools with 8 learning areas (The Arts, Health and PE, English, Learning Languages, Mathematics, Science, Social Sciences and Technology) to be taught and weighted appropriately. The school has reviewed the feedback from last year through the Parent Information Evening and Parent Survey and visually created a "Plan on a Page" that sets the focus for the next 3 Years. As a school group, we are hugely aware of the ongoing affects of COVID on our town and the implications this will have for our small school. We are so fortunate to have local

business support and an environment that supports our future planning. This includes Professional Development for staff, accessing the skills and talents of our local experts and making use of the tools and resources that are evident through our school build.
