Introduction for Families

The Ministry of Education have seven key principles that guide effective reporting and information sharing:

- 1. Ako (describes the teaching and learning relationship)
- 2. Focus and coverage (of learning across the curriculum)
- 3. Foundations for learning (progress and achievement in literacy, numeracy, key competencies and 'learning-to-learn' skills)
- 4. Student responsibility (to understand what they have learnt and what they need to focus on next)
- 5. Motivation (to understand and be involved in their own learning)
- 6. Technologies (to see the learning process and progress in real time)
- 7. Checking in with parents (so parents can understand where their child's learning is at and engage in supporting and encouraging them)

To enable this at our school we have chosen to implement the **Seesaw Journal Learning App**. This gives you

- The mobile ability to see their learning in real time.
- Your child ownership of their learning
- The ability to interact and reply to comments made by your child and your child's teacher, in real time, around their learning.

Seesaw is a new way we're sharing what your child is learning at school.





Seesaw gives your child a place to document their learning, be creative and learn how to use technology.

Why do we want our learners to keep a journal?



In your child's Seesaw journal they can...





Take a photo or video, make a drawing, write a note, share a link or add something they've made in another app.



Add a voice recording, drawing or type a few sentences to explain something better or give more detail.

All student content is safe and secure



Journals are only accessible by your child, their teachers and yourself Journals aren't public on the web and information is never shared with third parties

Seesaw - Reporting in plain language

Reporting in plain language helps parents and whānau be well informed, to make sense of their child's progress and achievement, and more able to support learning at home. Plain language written reporting, alongside the visual element of Seesaw presents your child's learning journey that is easily understood. It is language that helps support respectful and trusting relationships between students, parents and whānau.



The heart of the New Zealand Curriculum

Learning how to Learn - developing an identity as a lifelong learner and a greater emphasis on developing student autonomy.

A more holistic approach - interconnected nature of knowledge means that learning context needs to be developed with connections across the curriculum areas.

A more participatory view of learning (just having knowledge is not enough - you need to be able to apply your thinking across different contexts.

School-based curriculum development is more explicit - each school needs to bring learning alive for their local context and community.
